
# RESEARCH LIGHT IN REHABILITATION PRACTICE

- Distribute good practice.


## Background and purposes

The background for this educational sequence is to develop af closer cooperation between education and practice and to associate students learning about rehabilitation closer to professionel practice.

The main purposes of the project are:

- Students from the study of physiotherapy and occupational therapy acquire knowledge on rehabilitation and Research Light.
- Practice may have studied af relevant problem in rehabilitation.
- The students develop their ability to make practicebased research.

## METHOD – CASE STUDY



# Structure and content of the educational sequence

Students from the study of physiotherapy and occupationel therapy are together in af cross-disciplinary sequence for 3 weeks.

The issue is rehabilitation, and the students are introduced to the scientific method Research Light and this method is a path to work with evidence based practice.
